A word about the Sacrament of the Altar...

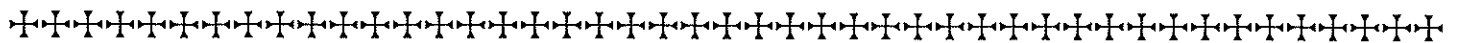
