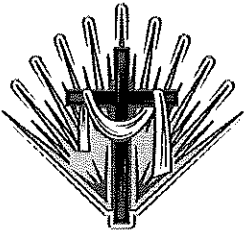

## “Managing God’s Gifts”

The biblical teaching of “stewardship” is often misunderstood in the life of the Christian and misapplied in the life of the church. When we hear the pastor or the stewardship committee (or finance committee, church council, or other congregational leadership) utter the dreaded “S-word,” we may have a variety of unwanted reactions.

Some hear the term “stewardship” with glassy-eyed confusion, not certain what it really means. Who uses the word “stewardship” these days?

Others hear the term and think, “Oh no! It’s that time of year again—the time when the pastor and church leaders ask us to increase our giving in the offering.” The assumption is that either the congregation is coming up short in its budget for the current year, or it is planning the budget for the coming fiscal year.

Others hear the word “stewardship” and, almost instinctively, clutch their wallets or purses to protect them from prying hands. After all, “It’s *my* money,” they think. “It’s nobody else’s business what I do with *my* money; that’s between me and God.” “I don’t want to hear another ‘money sermon!’”

Still others—including pastors—dread the annual stewardship campaign for fear of being perceived and labeled as “moneygrubbers.” Believe it or not, most pastors do not even want to preach the dreaded “money sermon”!

Scripture, however, says much on the topic of “stewardship,” because God is a gracious giver. When we faithfully receive and humbly learn what God says on the topic, we see that “stewardship” is not a foreign concept in the Scriptures, nor is it a frightening imposition upon our Christian faith and life. Properly understood, *all* of our Christian faith and life is “stewardship.” Stewardship involves, permeates, and informs *every aspect* of our Christian faith and life. It describes how we believe and live as God’s created, redeemed, and sanctified children in all of life.

The term “stewardship” often translates the Greek word *oikonomia*, which literally means “the management of a household or family.” A “steward,” then, is an *oikonomos*, or “one who manages a household.” Perhaps “management” and “manager” would be more familiar—and more useful—terms.

When we speak of “good stewardship” or “being good stewards,” we refer to managing the things that belong to God. Our triune God is the “lord of the manor” who owns the mansion and the whole estate (everything in the world, including us); we are merely the *managers*, or “stewards” (think “butler,” “maid,” “chef,” etc.), of what belongs to Him.

In *Managing God’s Gifts*, we will explore how “stewardship” embraces all of life. First, we will ponder good management of God’s created order, because “the earth is the LORD’s and the fullness thereof” (Psalm 24:1). Next, we will explore how we can be “good stewards” (managers) in our relations with other people, serving them in our vocations and bearing their burdens (Galatians 6:2). Third, we will consider time as God’s gift to be faithfully managed so that we may “be joyful and . . . do good as long as [we] live” (Ecclesiastes 3:12). Finally, we will explore how God calls us to manage His good gift of money—which belongs to Him, not to us—in order that we may be cheerful givers (2 Corinthians 9:7).

## MESSAGE FROM FAITH IN ACTION/SOCIAL MINISTRIES

It is a new season, FALL; and the thought of sharing overwhelms all of us as Thanksgiving draws near. Thanksgiving is around the corner and we are already preparing our food pantry for the holiday bags in November. Can you believe we have already ordered our first turkey breasts? We thank Jewel in Tinley Park for giving us a rain check to purchase 80 Butterball turkey breasts for a price of \$10 each. The Aldi price is \$12 each. Managers Tim and Immanuel agreed to make a special order for us and to honor that price. Thanks, you guys! Pastor Moeller and Mike Will submitted a Thrivent grant to help cover these costs, so \$500 of the \$800 purchase price of the turkey breasts will be covered! Thank you to the grant writers Pastor Moeller and Mike for their initiative to reach out to Thrivent for our pantry. If you would like to help us with this project you can make a monetary donation to offset the cost of the turkey breasts and holiday items, or you can buy extra items that will be gifted in the holiday bags. The following items are groceries that are needed for the holiday bags: stuffing, gravy packets, broth, cream of mushroom soup, cranberry sauce, canned yams, boxed potatoes-Au Gratin, scalloped, or packaged mashed potatoes, canned vegetables including tomatoes, carrots, peas, cake or browning mix, frosting, boxed Jello or pudding, olives, mushrooms, salad dressing or Manwich. Also, we are always in need of fall items to warm the body as well: soups, stews, chili, or other meals-in-a-can are items we especially appreciate while the seasons change. We thank you ahead of time for your generosity.

We are so thankful for the opportunity to serve our food pantry clients. Their gratitude is expressed in their smiles and voices, and we really want to pass these words of thanks on to you. In September 2024, we reached the largest number of clients served in a month, 95. Wow! I am thinking God wants us to continue to serve those in need. As we all know the price of feeding a family is very overwhelming, and the families we serve are feeling it as well. The clients also LOVE the spiritual encouragement of the Portals of Prayer. Sometimes life journeys can be difficult, and the booklets and our prayers encourage them. We appreciate your generosity and your prayers as well.

Many businesses are looking for an organization to serve during the holidays. If you know of a business that would like to organize a food drive for us during the holidays let us know, and we would be happy to contact them and share our information. Organizing a food pantry drop off space is easy to do, and we can provide the information and are willing to make the pick-up. Fliers about our food pantry are in the narthex.

Please also keep the date of November 2nd on your calendar. That is the date of Operation Blessing's Annual Pancake Brunch. Operation Blessing is our wonderful sister pantry that shares produce and refrigerated items with us to share with our clients. Supporting this event is a way to give back to them for their gifts. Please support them with your presence at their annual fundraiser. Mike Will is one of the cooks for this event, so please come greet Mike and meet some of the other Operation Blessing team. Please help our sister food pantry raise money to maintain their facility. The cost of the breakfast is \$10/person or \$25/family. The meal will include: pancakes, sausage, fruit, orange juice, coffee, and baked goods as well. Breakfast will be served from 8 am - 1 pm @ Moraine Valley Church, 6300 West 127th ST, Palos Heights.

We would like to thank the gardening team this year for their support and dedication. Planting, weeding, watering and harvesting all contributed to the gardens' success. Glen & Marilyn Bitner, John & Joanna Stiso, Debbie Mandac, Lorrie Ragland, Cathy Kumke, John Lilja, Debbie Will and newcomer Carol Small all deserve our thanks. As of September 26th we have harvested 121#'s from the Oak Lawn Community Garden and 565#'s from our St. Paul garden for a total of 686#'s. We still have plenty of tomatoes, peppers and squash to harvest so these numbers will increase. While the gardens take a lot of work the results are very much appreciated by our clients.

Thank you to June Hagberg for her service to our board. June has been a FIA volunteer as long as we can remember. June is now stepping down because of health and other reasons, and has decided to not run for reelection in November. We have reminisced several times over the wonderful memories of the FIA beginnings. June knows so many of our food pantry clients personally. During the pre-COVID days, June had the wonderful job of registering our clients. Our clients loved her and Rich. As June would register them, Rich would tell his jokes and keep the guests entertained. :) Food Pantry was a big social event for our food pantry guests those days. She helped us with the move from our tiny pantry in the Founder's room closet, to where we are today. She organized BEDS dinners and developed the "menu" and the "shopping list" :). We will miss this caring sister in Christ. Thank you June, God's good and faithful servant! You will always be in our hearts. ♥

Through you and our sponsors we have been blessed to serve those in need. The September food pantry served 95 families, 270 individuals. The September BEDS cook team cooked for 20 individuals. The meal included ham, (meatloaf for non-pork clients), scalloped potatoes, broccoli w/ almonds & parmesan, salad, apples, milk, and Linda Fogarty's lemon pound cake.

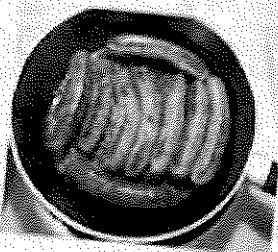
